HOW WE WILL HELP

- **Technical Assistance and Support**

NMCHWDC and partners will work with states/jurisdictions to develop and implement Evidence-based or informed Strategy Measures in context of individual population needs.

- **Evidence Analysis Reports**

The project consortium will interpret research and enlist subject matter experts to update analysis reports with practical strategies to support State Action Plans.

- **Team of Experts**

The project will tap a team of 30 researchers and professionals in the field to provide expert guidance in understanding the research and answering questions.

- **Educational Tools**

Staff will use approaches developed by the MCH Navigator to create learning tools that show how to convert evidence-based/informed research into actionable programs.
